

1.03 Policy on Anti-Doping

Statement on Anti-Doping

Golf Ontario is committed to ensuring a safe and positive environment of fair play and to protecting a competitor's right to participate in a doping free environment. In light of the recent legalization of the use of marijuana in Canada, competitors are reminded that marijuana still remains on the list of prohibited substances with the exception of pure cannabidiol (CBD).

All competitors must comply with Golf Ontario's Policy on Anti-Doping. As stated in the policy, we will at all times adhere to the standards of Golf Canada and the adoption of the 2015 Canadian Anti-Doping Program (CAPD). Competitors are encouraged to be familiar with CAPD and to comply with the [list of prohibited substances](#) during competition.

Use of substances on the prohibited list prescribed by a licensed physician for therapeutic or medical use may be used under the circumstances outlined by the Canadian Centre for Ethics in Sport for [Therapeutic Use Exemptions](#).

Competitors with further questions should contact the Tournament Director for guidance.

Policy

1. Golf Canada has adopted the 2015 Canadian Anti-Doping Program (CADP) as its primary domestic anti-doping policy. As a member of Golf Canada, the CADP also applies to Golf Ontario. Administered on behalf of Golf Canada by the Canadian Centre for Ethics in Sport (CCES), the 2015 CADP is fully compliant with the 2015 World Anti-Doping Code, International Standards and Guidelines as they may exist from time to time. 2. In addition, Golf Canada, as a member federation of International Golf Federation, must also be fully compliant with the International Golf Federation anti-doping rules. The International Golf Federation anti-doping rules may apply to certain members of Golf Ontario in certain situations. The International Golf Federation anti-doping rules are fully compliant with the 2015 World Anti-Doping Code, International Standards and Guidelines as they may exist from time to time. In the event of a conflict between the 2015 CADP and/or the International Golf Federation anti-doping rules and (i) any other anti-doping policies established by Golf Ontario or (ii) any other anti-doping policies established by Golf Canada, the 2015 CADP or the International Golf Federation anti-doping rules shall prevail, as applicable.
